**Note: Summary of total reported cases:**

There was a significant increase of 37% of the total reported Chlamydia cases from 655 cases in 2009 to 900 cases in 2010.

There was a significant increase of 60% of the total reported Gonorrhea cases from 61 cases in 2009 to 98 cases in 2010.

The number of new HIV infections from 2009 to 2010 increased by 125%.

There was a significant increase of 200% of the total reported AIDS cases from 2 cases in 2009 to 6 cases in 2010.

For syphilis cases, there was a decrease of 8% of the total reported cases from 12 cases in 2009 to 11 cases in 2010.

There was a decrease of 44% of reported genital warts from 9 cases in 2009 to 5 cases in 2010.

There was a significant decrease of 42% of the total reported Herpes Simplex II cases from 35 cases in 2009 to 20 cases in 2010.

There was a decrease of 3% of the total reported Trichomoniasis cases from 127 cases in 2009 to 123 cases in 2010.

\*Syphilis cases: 710 primary, 720 secondary, 740 with unknown duration

**Rate of Chlamydia per 100,000 population:**

The total rate of chlamydia for Guam in **2009 was 352 per 100,000** and **2010 was 498 per 100,000**.

The total rate for the U.S. and outlying areas (Guam Puerto Rico and Virgin Islands) was 406.3 per 100,000.
